

Substituting the GRE for the GMAT in the Admission Index calculation

1) The GRE is an acceptable substitute for the GMAT if the following minimum scores are met:

If the verbal score is:	then the quantitative score must be at least:
142-145	148
146-151	146
152-155	142
156 or above	140

Please note that if the Verbal score is below 142, or the Quantitative score is below 140, the scores **cannot** be used in the admission index and the applicant cannot be *regularly admitted* to the MBA program.

2) Petitioning when one GRE score is adequate, and one GRE score is below minimum:

If one of the values (Verbal or Quantitative) is adequate and the other value (Quantitative or Verbal) is only slightly below the minimum (thereby falling into the red zone above), the applicant should submit an Admission Petition at the Graduate School for consideration for conditional admission to the MBA program, in addition to their application.
